The Thursday before Ash Wednesday - or "Dirty Thursday" as it's known in parts of Switzerland - marks the start of another frenzied carnival season in many towns across the country.

Carnival is a license for the normally wellbehaved Swiss to let their hair down and celebrate the festival in their own unique

In Lucerne, dozens of costumed brass bands took their signal from a pre-dawn gun salute on Thursday to strike the first dissonant chords of marches and pop songs, and begin parading through the streets and alleys of the old town.

The unique musical combination is known in Swiss-German as "Guggenmusik"

Dirty Thursday begins in Lucerne and some other German-speaking towns at precisely 5am. The well-behaved mayhem that follows is known as "Fasnacht" and lasts until Ash Wednesday the following week.

Black humor has been part of carnival since the Middle Ages when the lower classes seized the opportunity to mock their rulers from the safety of their disguises.
